

# **Activity Recommendations**

#### **Glacier National Park**

As one of the country's most beautiful natural areas with pristine forests, alpine meadows, rugged mountains, spectacular lakes, and over 700 miles of trails, Glacier is a hiker's paradise for adventurous visitors alike. Visit the park's <u>website</u> to learn more about the hiking trails in Glacier National Park.

Plan on visiting Glacier National Park this summer? To access Glacier National Park during peak hours (6am-4pm) you must purchase a vehicle entry ticket that is separate from your park admission ticket. Vehicle entry tickets are valid for 3 days, but they are limited. We highly recommend you buy your ticketed entry ASAP to ensure you can access the park during your visit. No ticket to enter Glacier National Park? No problem! There is still plenty to see and do in the park after 4pm and before 6am. Grab a coffee and catch the sunrise, go for an early morning hike, or pack a picnic and enjoy the sunset at Lake McDonald! Also, try checking out many of the nearby parks and trail systems outside Glacier that still offer incredible access to Montana's wild backcountry.

Note: Dogs are not allowed on trails in Glacier National Park.

### **Mountain Biking & Fat Tire Biking**

The <u>Whitefish Bike Retreat</u> is the ultimate destination for epic mountain & fat tire biking! Bikes can be rented at the <u>Whitefish Bike Retreat</u> or <u>Glacier Cyclery & Nordic</u>. Rentals book up quickly, so we recommend reserving in advance.

# Kayak, Paddleboard, & Float

The Whitefish area has plenty of nearby rivers and lakes that will exceed your aquatic expectations! Visit Flathead Lake, Whitefish Lake, Upper and Lower Stillwater Lakes, Lake Five, Whitefish River, or McDonald Creek. Whitefish Outfitters provides kayak, stand up paddle board, and river tube rentals for those wanting to explore by water or simply soak up the sun and relax.

### Fly Fishing

## **Whitefish Trail System**

The <u>Whitefish Trail System</u> is a user supported, community-driven asset providing 43 miles of natural surface trails and 12 trailheads/connectors located in a forested, rural environment. The trails welcome families including hikers, dog walkers, mountain bikers, horseback riders, and runners of all abilities.

#### Whitefish Mountain Resort Scenic Lift

Choose from an enclosed gondola or an open chairlift, then sit back and enjoy the mountain scenery as well as views of Whitefish Lake, the Flathead Valley, and Glacier National Park. At the top grab a bite and beverage or grab & go food is also available as well. Visit their <u>website</u> for more information.

### **Snowshoeing**

Note: Dogs are allowed to accompany you on the Whitefish Trail and at Round Meadow, however, they are not allowed on trails in Glacier National Park or at Whitefish Mountain Resort.

Note: Dogs are not allowed at Glacier Nordic Center, on trails in Glacier National Park, or on trails at Whitefish Mountain Resort.
